The Board of Commissioners met in a **REGULAR MEETING** with Mayor Santiago presiding. Members present included Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas and Commissioner Cooper. City Solicitor, Brock Russell, and Administrator, Regina Burke were also present.

Invocation was given by Pastor Jonathan Merki from the Church of Nazarene followed by the salute to the flag.

Mayor Santiago made the statement required by the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975: "This meeting is being conducted in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975, was advertised, posted and made available to the public as required by Statute. The Municipal Clerk is directed to include a statement in the minutes of this meeting."

#### **City Clerk to Review Changes to the Agenda**

Mayor Santiago asked if there were any changes to the agenda. City Clerk, Jeanne Parkinson responded no items were added after the publication date on Friday, September 3, 2021. However, Ms. Parkinson explained the agenda was published early on Wednesday, September 1, 2021 due to a family emergency and was not sure when she would be back in the office.

The City Clerk clarified that Commissioner Udalovas' report is a motion to receive the draft of the proposed revisions to Chapter 30 in regard to the September 13th Planning Board meeting and further clarified that Resolution Items 1 through 3 are approving letters of support rather than letters of intent.

#### **Bills**

#### **Minutes**

Vice-Mayor Parent made a motion to approve to dispense with the reading of the minutes for August 17, 2021 Regular Meeting and Closed Session Meeting. Commissioner Pepitone seconded the motion, which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper, and Mayor Santiago.

#### **Presentations**

Commissioner Pepitone presented Mary Messick with a Certificate of Appreciation for her assistance in making the Millville Police Department's 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual National Night Out a great success.

Mayor Santiago congratulated Ms. Messick.

#### **Public Comment on Agenda Items Only**

Mayor Santiago stated that this is the time for any public comment on agenda items only if anyone wishes to be heard.

Scott Johnson, from OmniTrax, stated they operate the Winchester and Western WW Railway in town and questioned the changing of the resolutions from letter of intent to letter of support and wanted verification that the resolution is approving a letter of support. The City Clerk provided confirmation to Mr. Johnson that the resolution is approving a letter of support.

#### **Reports of Commissioners**

##### **Commissioner Cooper**

Commissioner Cooper reported that the Parks Department have cut grass on 16 properties in the past two weeks.

Commissioner Cooper also reported that the Millville Parks Department teamed up with the Youth Love Movement to apply new mulch at Governor Stokes and thanked everyone for coming out to assist in making the park beautiful and safe.

Commissioner Cooper announced the following upcoming projects and events:

- Fall Cleanups throughout all the parks
- Complete last pass of grass cutting on properties throughout the city
- 20<sup>th</sup> Annual 911 Ceremony: September 11, 2021, at 8:30 a.m. at Buck Park, in event of increment weather the event will be held in the Millville Fire Department
- Craft Nights: September 15, 2021; October 20, 2021 and November 3, 2021. The craft series will be a reversible fall and winter welcome sign.
- The Dog Park Grand Opening: September 18, 2021, 11:30 a.m. From 11:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. there will be dog vendors and activities. Dog Contest will be held at 1:00 p.m.
- Annual Baby Show (Millville Residents Only Ages 4 and under): September 25, 2021 at Corson Park. Registration 12:00 p.m. and show starts promptly at 1:00 p.m.
- Millville First Annual Hispanic Heritage Day and Parade: September 26, 2021. Begins at 12:00 noon on High Street and Pine Street to High Street and Harrison Street. The festival will be held behind Lakeside Middle School on the football fields from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.

#### **Commissioner Pepitone**

Commissioner Pepitone stated he looked into what POPS is in response to Angeline Broomhall's inquiry at the last Commission Meeting. He explained that it is a program that was created to enable closer community police relationships, which began in the Prosecutor's Office when they received a grant that was used for Community Policing. Commissioner Pepitone stated Vineland, Millville and Bridgeton are involved in the program. The purpose of the program is to improve the relationship of the community and the police and identify the different areas in the City that are deemed hotspots and then assign police officers to those areas to potentially improve the relationship with the community and the police officers in order to diagnose the problems in those areas.

#### **Commissioner Udalovas**

Commissioner Udalovas reminded everyone that the Department of Public Affairs has released the application for interested tenants to apply for the CDBG Rental Assistance Program via the City of Millville's website or by paper form made available at City Hall. The program is applied for by tenants demonstrating need of rental assistance by providing the necessary documentation. The payment is disbursed directly to landlords or mortgagors pursuant to the program requirements. Commissioner Udalovas stated all interested applicants may contact Yasmin Moreno via email or by calling (856) 825-7000 Ext. 7341.

Commissioner Udalovas announced that the Planning Board Meeting is on September 13, 2021 at 6:30 p.m., Commission Chamber, 4<sup>th</sup> floor City Hall. She stated the agenda will be published on Thursday, September 9, 2021 on the Planning Board page of the City of Millville website at [www.millvillenj.gov](http://www.millvillenj.gov).

Commissioner Udalovas announced that the Planning Department has coordinated interdepartmental efforts with Zoning and Engineering Departments to revise the draft ordinance of the Chapter 30 Land Use Regulations in sections with assistance from Chairman Robert Gallagher and Mr. Jay Laubengeyer of the Planning Board to present to the public over the coming months with opportunities for feedback. She advised that an attachment of a portion of the revised Chapter 30 draft is included on tonight's agenda under her Commissioner Report. Commissioner Udalovas stated the public can provide feedback on the draft ordinance during the public comment portion of tonight's meeting and at the Planning Board Meeting on September 13, 2021.

Commissioner Udalovas made a motion to receive and file the proposed revisions to the Chapter 30 Land Use Regulations in regard to the September 13, 2021 Planning Board Meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cooper and was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper, and Mayor Santiago.

### **Vice-Mayor Parent**

Vice-Mayor Parent expressed his sincere condolences to Commissioner Udalovas for the passing of her father.

Vice-Mayor Parent announced that the city has received a check on the recovery plan in the amount of over 3 million dollars and expects another 3.4 or 3.5 million after the first of the year. He anticipates the next administration will come up with some ideas on how to spend those dollars.

Vice-Mayor Parent stated he has been meeting with the Mayor, City Administrator Regina Burke and the Chief Financial Officer in reference to the recovery plan. He stated they have been receiving recommendations of projects from the Commissioners and their departments that they would like to use the Recovery Plan dollars spent on. He stated the recommendations are being reviewed and the priority list will be decided by the entire governing body.

Vice-Mayor Parent stated he is all for investing the money in the community and reassured the public the funds will be put to good use and hopes to invest it in the city's infrastructure.

Vice-Mayor Parent also emphasized that any project or improvements the governing body wants to use the Recovery Plan dollars on must be approved by the State of New Jersey first.

Vice-Mayor Parent also announced that the UEZ Program is coming back to the City of Millville and stated that is a windfall for the next administration. It is a 10 year plan within the City of Millville's zone and a lot of revenue will come through with state tax, which is 7 cents and the City of Millville gets 3.5 cents back.

Vice-Mayor Parent stated he anticipates both projects will aid in kickstarting the City of Millville's economic development, which will provide funds needed to launch numerous projects that he feels confident that will not only assist this administration, but the next administration to move forward.

### **Mayor Santiago**

Mayor Santiago moved to receive and file the Streets and Roads Report for the month of August 2021. Vice-Mayor Parent seconded the motion. The motion was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper, and Mayor Santiago.

Mayor Santiago stated that he attended the Eskibal Basketball Game at Union Lake between the City of Millville and Bridgeton for ages 12 to 14. Mayor Santiago provided recognition and expressed his admiration to JT Burks, who organized the basketball game and refereed the game.

Mayor Santiago also stated that he attended the airshow this weekend and was pleased to announce that it was a successful event with 8 to 10 thousand spectators in attendance on Saturday, Sunday the attendance was a little smaller. Mayor Santiago thanked Lisa Jester and her volunteer group

who did a wonderful job. He also thanked the communities law enforcement who were present during the event to keep everyone safe.

### **Ordinances on 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading**

The City Clerk read the following Ordinances on 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading:

An Ordinance approving and authorizing an application to the Cumberland County Roadway Department for the Holly City Football League to hold a Coin Drop on October 2, 2021 and October 3, 2021 at the intersections of Buckshutem Road and Cedarville Road. Commissioner Cooper moved for the adoption of this ordinance on second and final reading which was seconded by Commissioner Udalovas.

Mayor Santiago asked if anyone wished to be heard on this item only. There being no response, Mayor Santiago declared the public hearing on this item closed.

The motion was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

An Ordinance approving the Private Sale of 124-126 South 6th Street, a substandard city owned lot, to Shirley Keller, the owner of all the contiguous lots for \$5,000.00. Commissioner Cooper moved for the adoption of this ordinance on second and final reading which was seconded by Commissioner Udalovas.

Mayor Santiago asked if anyone wished to be heard on this item only. There being no response, Mayor Santiago declared the public hearing on this item closed.

The motion was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

## Resolutions

The City Clerk read the following resolutions:

Commissioner Pepitone moved for the adoption of this resolution which was seconded by Vice-Mayor Parent and carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Brock Russell, City Solicitor, explained that due to the change in the law the city could lose police officers to other towns, but by opting in to Examination Exemption Civil Service Hiring Procedures the City of Millville would be able to hire police officers from other towns as well.

Resolution No. 217-2021 approving letter of support for OmniTRAX in the purchase and redevelopment of the aforesaid property known as Block 577, Lot 1 to utilize said property as a transload facility. Commissioner Udalovas moved for the adoption of this resolution which was seconded by Commissioner Cooper and carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Resolution No. 218-2021 approving letter of support to Apothca Cultivation, Inc. to operate a cannabis cultivation facility at the proposed location of 609 Orange Street. Commissioner Udalovas moved for the adoption of this resolution which was seconded by Commissioner Cooper and carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Resolution No. 219-2021 approving letter of support to Apothca Manufacturing, Inc. to operate a cannabis manufacturing facility at the proposed location of 609 Orange Street. Commissioner Udalovas moved for the adoption of this resolution which was seconded by Commissioner Cooper and carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

## Public Comment

There being no further business, Mayor Santiago stated we have now reached the public comment portion of our meeting. Anyone who would like to address the commission, please go to the podium, state your name, and address your concerns. Please limit your comments to approximately 5 minutes.

Angeline Broomhall of Millville addressed the governing body and expressed his concerns that some candidates trespassed on Ferguson Court and the Senior High Rises to get their petitions signed. Ms. Broomhall urged the governing body to not and to please recommend that it is a violation to trespass on Ferguson Court, unless you are personally invited.

Joseph Sooy of Millville inquired that since he was not one of the individuals that went to a High Rise or Ferguson Court, but some of the candidates did, does he have permission to go there as well and would like to know who he talks to for arrangements to do that.

Seeing nobody else come forth, Mayor Santiago deemed the public comments portion closed.

## Comments by Commissioners

### Commissioner Cooper

Commissioner Cooper announced that on July 5<sup>th</sup> a special addition of 4<sup>th</sup> Fridays was held at Buck Park, which was a Fourth Friday Back To School Gospel Fest with 148 children in attendance. He stated over 150 backpacks were giving out and one had a surprise free limousine ride in it for 3 hours. He stated many were in attendance and it was a great event with food, many activities and live music.

Commissioner Pepitone echoed Commissioner Cooper sentiment on what a great event the Fourth Friday Back To School Gospel Fest was and hopes to see more events like that in the future.

### Commissioner Pepitone

Commissioner Pepitone responded to the comments made during the public hearing about campaigning. He stated that as far as he knew they didn't campaign generally in the areas mentioned, but there were specific places they went to where they knew the individuals were going to be home. He extended his sincere apologies if they knocked on the wrong door and he emphasized they are not out to intimidate the public and were only looking for support of the individuals that were friendly to them.

**Commissioner Udalovas**

Commissioner Udalovas reminded everyone the Planning Board agenda will be published by 4:30 p.m. this Thursday for the September 13<sup>th</sup> meeting to discuss the draft revisions of Chapter 30.

**Vice-Mayor Parent**

Vice-Mayor Parent stated he has never campaigned in a high-rise building, because he knows it is illegal to do that, which includes Ferguson Court and other similar federal buildings. He stated that everyone is not privy of the law but advised everyone to please be courteous when you are out campaigning.

Vice-Mayor Parent again expressed how pleased he was regarding UEZ coming back and receiving the Recovery Plan monies.

Vice-Mayor Parent wished all 10 candidates the best of luck with their campaign

**Mayor Santiago**

Mayor Santiago wished all the teachers and children good luck throughout the school year.

Mayor Santiago stated that the current commission has fought very well for the citizens of Millville and that he is very proud of being a part of this commission. He stated the commission is no good, unless they have the support of the staff like the City Administrator and Jeanne Parkinson and the City Solicitor and expressed his sincere appreciation for their support.

**Adjournment**

There being no further comments the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Commissioner Pepitone and seconded by Commissioner Cooper subject to the call of the chair. All were in favor. None were opposed.
