#### **Open Public Meeting Statement by Mayor Orndorf**

#### **City Clerk To Review Changes To the Agenda**

Wayne Johnson provided a slide show presentation on the New Jersey Infrastructure Trust Fund, which is on file in the City Clerk's Office, which covered the following topics:

- Sources of Funding for Drinking Water and Clean Water
- Reviewed the availability of information on the NJ Infrastructure Trust Funds home webpage
- Type of Projects: Wastewater Infrastructure, Stormwater Management, Site Remediation, Water Recycling, Equipment Purchases and Planning and Design
- Eligible Recipients and Non-Eligible Recipients
- Utilized the Trust Fund for Drinking Water for Geissinger Avenue Well No. 18
- Planning a new well and treatment possibly out by Bridgeton Pike, will apply for funding through the Infrastructure Trust Fund
- Priority Categories and Ranking for projects- Drinking Water ranks the highest
- Affordability Criteria & Disadvantaged Communities
- Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)
- The Intended Use Plan (IUP)
- Funding Packages and Principal Forgiveness
- Approval Process Milestones

Vice-Mayor Sooy thanked Wayne Johnson for his presentation and also Commissioner Watson for publicly initiating the conversation.
